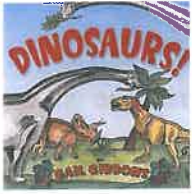


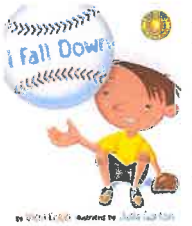


## Non - Fiction Books



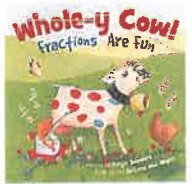
**Dinosaurs** - Gail Gibbons
